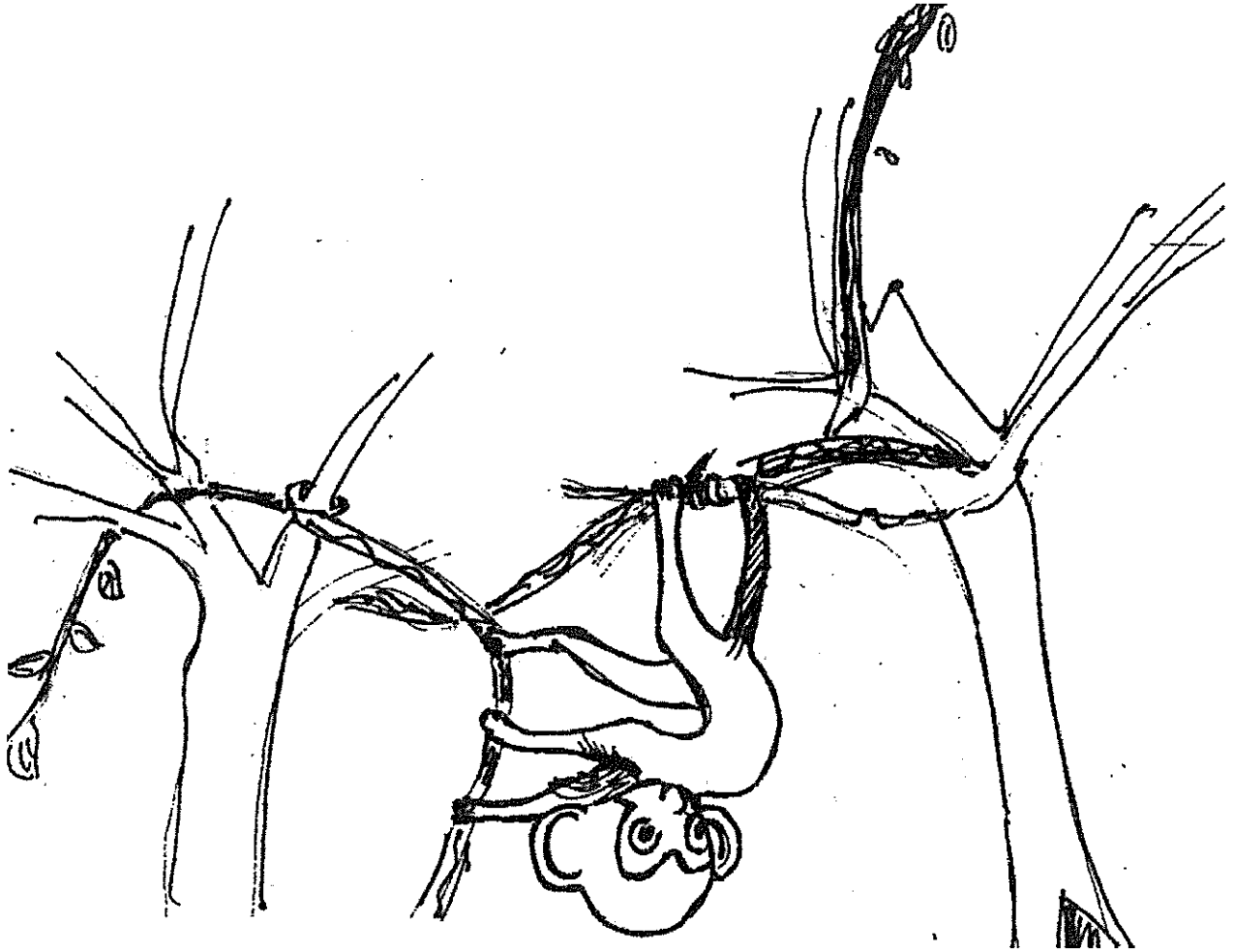

Kangaroos live in Australia.

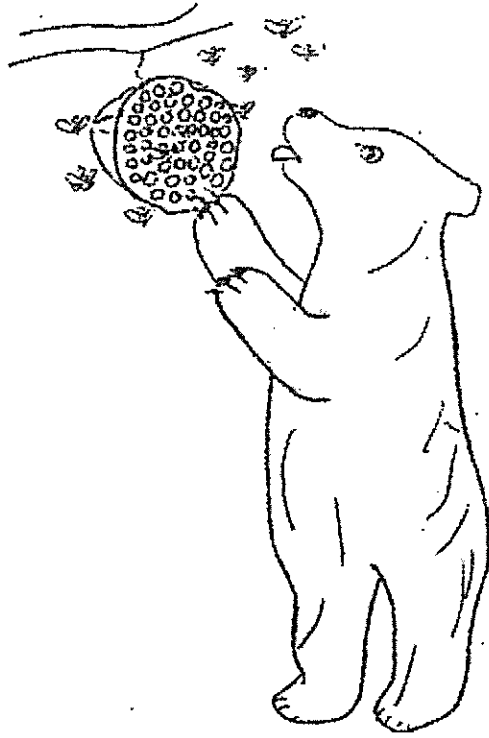


**A monkey is a wild animal that can swing with its tail and ankles.**

Color the bear black or brown.

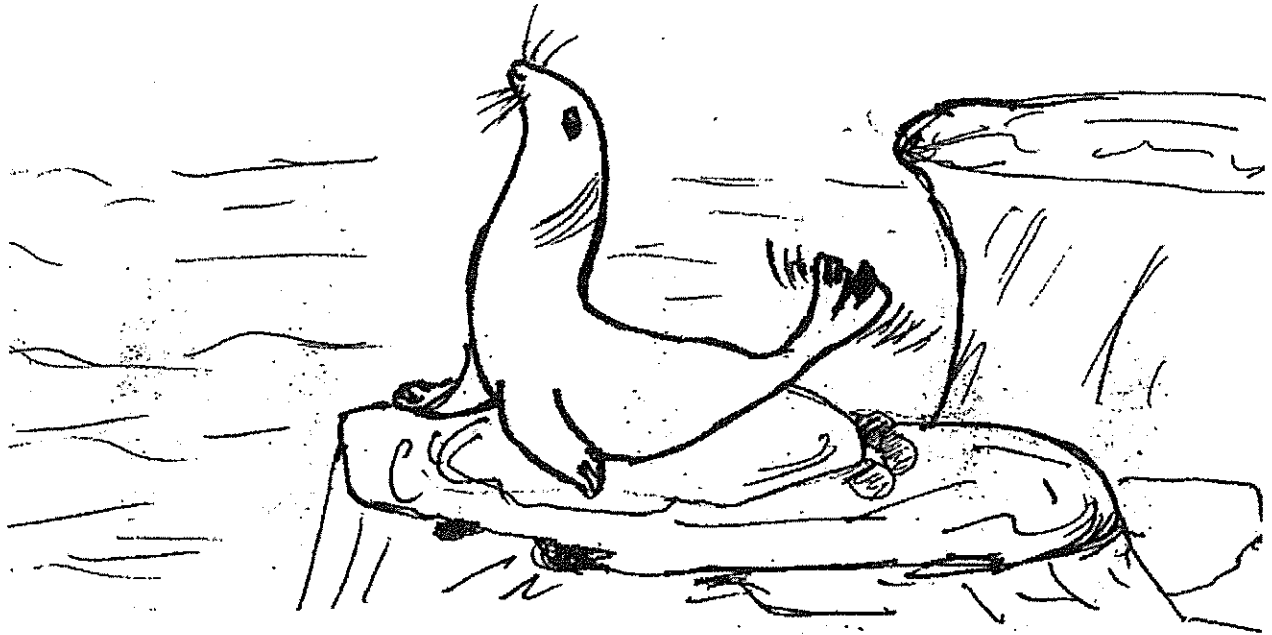
The bear likes honey, apples and bugs.

They eat small sea animals like fish and shrimp.

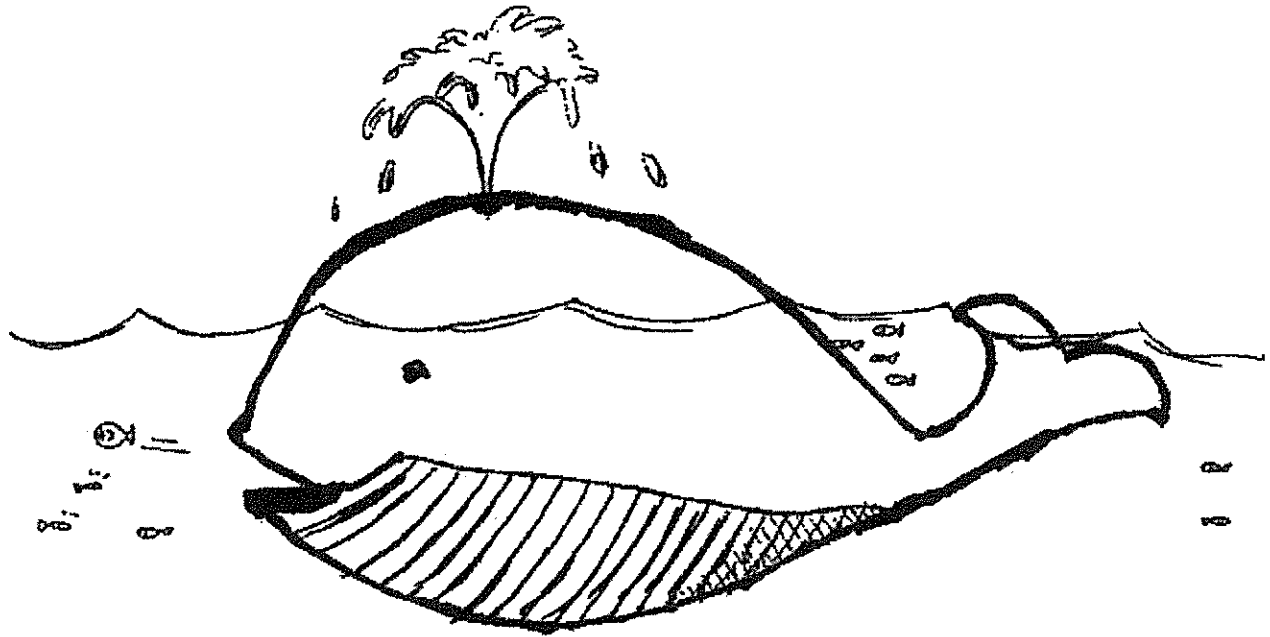


**A dolphin is a sea animal that has a nose like a bottle.**

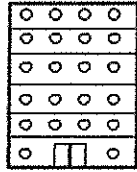

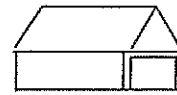

## Glossary

(A brief dictionary)

### **Dolphin/dolphins:**

Dolphins are ocean animals. They are very smart and can be trained to do tricks.

### **Elephant/elephants:**

An elephant is a very large animal with a trunk (nose) and tusks (teeth).

### **Giraffe/giraffes:**

A giraffe has a long neck. Giraffes are the tallest animals in the world.

### **Kangaroo/kangaroos:**

A kangaroo has a thick, strong tail. The mother kangaroo carries her baby in a pouch.

### **Lion/lions:**

A lion is large and strong. Daddy lion has a thick mane around his head.

### **Monkey/monkeys:**

Monkeys are very smart. Most of them live up in the trees.

### **Tiger/tigers:**

A tiger is a big wild cat. Tigers are in danger of extinction (dying out).

### **Whale/whales:**

Whales are the largest and oldest animals on Earth. They are found in every ocean.

### **Zebra/zebras:**

Zebras live in Africa. They have black and white striped coats.
